## La redoute rugs reviews

I've been dreaming of a new carpet in our living room ever since we had our milk bottle incident with my eldest daughter. Funnily enough, my Ikea Gaser rug is the most read post in the history of my blog, which I find quite interesting. I think there are a lot of people out there who can relate to our little accident. Decorating for children can be difficult – should I choose my dream carpet or choose something more practical? These questions were in my head when I was looking for our new carpet and it was not an easy task to be honest. Berber-style carpets have been on my radar for a while now. I love the design and feel that they are the perfect complement to any modern or contemporary space. First, I wasn't entirely sure if the Berber-style carpet would fit my style. At one point I went for a fairly elegant and formal look in our living room and everything had to match. Now I'm about to mismatch. Do not get me wrong, I think it is important that furniture and accessories work together to create a consistent look, but in fact it is more visually interesting if everything does not fit. I've been on the eye on La Redoute Afaw shaggy carpet for a while now, but every time I just suddenly sold out and well I think I felt it wasn't supposed to be. About a month ago I noticed that the carpet was back in stock (I literally kept checking the website every few weeks) and I thought I couldn't miss this opportunity again. Especially since I really wanted to get rid of our old carpet, which was too small and dark for my liking. So I finally ordered the carpet online (and received 15% off, which was nice) and I'm so glad I did because it sold again in white. You can still buy it in black in small and large sizes however. Do you think this carpet is so famous that it has its own Instagram account?! La Redoute also has some seriously gorgeous Berber style real wool carpets that are worth checking out. They look a little too beige for my taste, but it all depends on what you're after. When the carpet finally arrived, I knew I had made the right decision. I just love it. It feels incredibly soft and I love the pattern, although at first I thought I'd prefer a more consistent pattern. The carpet looks exactly like the website, if not better. This time I chose the largest available size (200 x 290 cm). Our living room is a decent size and I didn't want to repeat the mistake I made with my Ikea carpet. From day one I knew it was too small and never looked good. Many people think that a large carpet will make the room smaller, but in fact it is the opposite, especially if you choose a bright color. Our new carpet really sets the room up and I wanted to make sure I could put the furniture (especially the feet of our sofa) on the carpet. The carpet can completely make or break so it is really important to get the right color and size. And once I think I actually nailed both. I think this carpet is amazing with dark gray furniture and silver accessories, but the truth is that it is so versatile, you can style it in a hundred different ways if you want. You can not really go wrong with this carpet in my opinion. If you are still on the fence, I have listed some advantages and disadvantages that will hopefully help you in the decision-making process. Affordable Pros It is in 3 different sizes and colors Looks good It does not throw easy to clean (hoover and remove stains from) It feels soft and fluffy Cons Material does not look like real wool Funny smell for the first few days The pattern can be more consistent (but it depends on your taste) As you could see there were more pluses than disadvantages, which is why I decided to keep the carpet. I had some trouble deciding between this carpet and the West Elm Souk carpet (which would have been 4 times the price!) and I was actually having second thoughts when I walked into our living room only to find a half-eaten banana smushed in front of the carpet. It was the work of our 16 months of life, but fortunately it fell beautifully out of the fabric, a little hot water and a few drops of fairy liquid. My children may have snacks in the living room, although milk on the carpet is still not allowed for obvious reasons. I love the fact that I don't have to stress about this carpet and that girls can feel relaxed and comfortable in the living room (and not worry about messing up mom's new carpet). While I doubt it's our eternal carpet, I think it's perfect for us at the moment, given our lifestyle (i.e. the fact that we have young children). In addition, the La Redoute Afaw carpet is simply gorgeous and let's not forget that it is, without a doubt, the best value Berber style carpet that I've seen there. Do you have your dream carpet now or stick to a more sensible option until your kids get a bit older? So when you find yourself dealing with them again, you have to go through the whole rigmarole again! Every child in the team does not have access to the previous communication. The warehouse does not update the website with what is and is not in stock, and employees do not have compunction about sending part of the order, e.g. pajamas No bottom. Instead of training staff politely stonewall customers should group sharing recordings of difficult clients. What they'll probably do is sniggering into their cup of coffee. Phew! This company seems to have such mixed opinions. I was very upset about ordering from them, but I really wanted a specific pair of shoes. I thought most of the bad reviews were for furniture, and so I also thought that the shoe side of things wouldn't be bad. I was told when the order was ready for shipment and when it was delivered to the collection point. I bought two sizes, just in case, and returned the second pair, in another drop off/rebound point a few days later. Within days I received a notification that they had received shoes and another day or so, the refund was back in my bank account. For me, it was a really happy experience. I think it's probably one of those companies that deals with different outsourcings, so it's really diverse. I also used drop-off/collection points instead of home delivery and home pickup – which I know in some situations that just isn't possible – and so maybe I had a little more control over things. I wonder if there is a little more responsibility in this way too. Too.
